### IDENTIFICATION:



-  [Alaska Fishing License](#)
-  Government-issued identification or passport

### FISHING GEAR:





-  1-2 Fly Rods – 5wt & 8wt
-  Fly lines, leader and tippet materials
-  Flies – Chernobyl ants, anything made with *closed-cell foam*, hippy stompers, woolly buggers and many other classic trout patterns, Size 6 to 10 barbless hooks preferred
-  Nippers

\*\*All gear will be provided by the guide & host, however if you'd like to use your own this is what we suggest





### HAT AND GLOVES:

-  Hats: beanie and baseball style hat
-  Gloves: warm, waterproof gloves, fingerless







### TOP - WARM CLOTHING:

-  Polyester or natural fiber tops
-  Sweaters/sweatshirts
-  Tank tops
-  Wool top long sleeve







### BOTTOM:

-  Jeans (lodge only) or fleece pants
-  Polyester legging
-  Wool legging
-  Wool or fleece socks








### OUTERWEAR:

-  Chest Waders with belt
-  Wader Boots (non felt soled)
-  Neck Tubes
-  Waterproof wading jacket
-  Wind proof layer
-  Down coat



### TOILETRIES:

-  Hand warmers
-  Medications and medicinal needs
-  Personal toiletries
-  Strong mosquito repellent w/DEET
-  Sunscreen
-  Water bottle

### ACCESSORIES:

-  Camera or Go-Pro
-  Head net for mosquitos
-  Lanyard
-  Lodge shoes (sandals or tennis shoes)
-  1-2 Polarized sunglasses and/or prescription eyewear (with leash)
-  Waterproof bag with extra clothing
-  Device chargers

### RECOMMENDED:

-  Snacks for in between meals
-  Cash for tipping the lodge staff and fishing guides

\*\*Dress in layers, weather in Nome area in June can be sunny and mild, or rainy and windy. A warm layer under a rain jacket is a great option.
